8 weeks in-class, 2-week practicum at Mosaic's potash mine
10 weeks total

Student funding provided - \$0 Tuition

Once accepted into course, funding application process will begin

Recruiting Métis, First Nations, and Inuit students

Course requirements: Gr. 12 or equivalent, ability to pass drug and alcohol test, clean criminal record for 7 years

100% Attendance required for 10 weeks
Hot breakfast and lunch served daily

Career Fair with interview opportunities

Interviews with sponsoring organizations prior to practicum
